These internships are only open to Canadian citizens or permanent residents who are under 35 years of age at the time of application and enrolled in an undergraduate co-op program or the graduate Masters of International Forestry (MIF) program at UBC Forestry. These internships must be no less than three months in length, to be eligible for the Queen Elizabeth Scholars funding. A maximum of three internships will be awarded each year.
